WHERE TO PLAY

WHERE TO BEACH

Kiawah Island

Dogs are allowed on the beach from March 16 – October 31, leashed at all times. From November 1 – March 15, dogs can be off-leash from 7am to 7pm, but must be leashed from 7pm to 7am.

Isle of Palms

Residents are encouraged to get a free annual dog permit from the Isle of Palms Police Department. Dogs can be off-leash from 5–9 a.m. (April 1–Sept 14) and 4–10 a.m. (Sept 15–Mar 31).

Sullivan's Island

Dog licenses are required on Sullivan's Island, available at Town Hall for \$50. During the summer, no dogs are allowed on the beach from 10am to 6pm. In the winter, dogs must be on-leash from 12pm–5am.
